**Reorienting the Middle East** Dale Hudson 2024-01-16 Stories of desert landscapes, cutting-edge production facilities, and lavish festivals often dominate narratives about film and digital media on the Arabian Peninsula. However, there is a more complicated history that reflects long-standing interconnections between the Persian Gulf, Arabian Sea, and Indian Ocean. Just as these waters are fluid spaces, so too is the flow of film and digital media between cultures in East Africa, Europe, North Africa, South Asia, Southwest Asia, and Southeast Asia. *Reorienting the Middle East* examines past and contemporary aspects of film and digital media in the Gulf that might not otherwise be apparent in dominant frameworks. Contributors consider oil companies that brought film exhibition to this area in the 1930s, the first Indian film produced on the Arabian Peninsula in the late 1970s, blackness in Iranian films, the role of Western funding in reshaping stories, Dubai's emergence in global film production, uses of online platforms for performance art, the development of film festivals and cinemas, and short films made by citizens and migrants that turn a lens on racism, sexism, national identity, and other rarely discussed social issues. *Reorienting the Middle East* offers new methods to analyze the often-neglected littoral spaces between nation-states and regions and to understand the role of film and digital media in shaping dialogue between area studies and film and media studies. Readers will find new pathways to rethink the limitations of dominant categories and frameworks in both fields.

**Sex Museums** Jennifer Tyburczy 2016-01-11 Museums have lengthy history, going back to the Renaissance Cabinets of Curiosity, and they are indices of changing fashions of perception insofar as the categories museum curators use to classify objects change over time. The major focus of Tyburczy's study is sexuality on display, which sets up, in turn, her investigation of the effects of museum display on the history of sexuality. She proposes that explicit display or restagings of sexual artifacts provides new ways for approaching and understanding issues of desire, sexual identity, and sexual practices as they intersect with the history of the modern museum and with sexual history during the past two centuries. Her fieldwork sites are: the Leather Archives & Museum in Chicago, the Museum of Sex in New York, the World Erotic Art Museum in Miami Beach, and El Museo del Sexo in Mexico City. Such institutions allow Tyburczy to show how alternative sexuality (inclusive of kink, fetish, and sadomasochistic cultures) and slavery dangerously crisscross on the surface of objects. There are plenty of cases here, in short, to keep the casual reader titillated and the erudite reader surprised."

Representation of the 'feminine Orient' and 'masculine Occident'* Sina Schmidt 2022-09-29 Seminar paper from the year 2021 in the subject American Studies - Culture and Applied Geography, grade: 1,3, University of Osnabrück, language: English, abstract: This thesis aims to examine the presence of Orientalism in U.S.-American mainstream popular culture. The basis for this is the movie "Sex and the City 2" (hereafter referred to as SatCII) from 2010, based on the globally successful series "Sex and the City". The series *Sex and the City* is one of the most successful series and few TV series have had such an impact on our contemporary culture. Its success story and its ongoing relevance – as there was even a third movie in discussion – makes the series and the movies highly interesting for academic purposes, since a critical examination of the represented themes provides genuine insights into today's society. In what way does SatCII project Orientalism? What is the significance behind the used Orientalist representations? What do these images reveal about the relationship between the United States and Eastern countries and, especially how does America see itself? Edward Said claims the representation of the Middle East has less to do with the Orient than it does with

'our' world. In order to answer the aforementioned questions, Chapter 2.1 deals with the representation of Orientalism and general Orientalist stereotyping in mainstream popular culture. Moreover, it gives insight into their origin and tries to shed light on the development of Orientalism over time. After that, in Chapter 2.2 the paper turns its attention to "Sex and the City" in order to examine whether the series is in hold of a feminist status, as this discourse is of importance for the ensuing analysis. The analysis in Chapter 2.3, then, looks at the ways in which SatCII depicts the ideology of the 'feminine Orient' and 'masculine Occident'. This part includes select scenes from the movie in order to underline how the U.S. views the East and itself. Finally, Chapter 2.4 deals with one of the characters of the show - Samantha Jones. She is the key figure that represents third wave feminist thinking best and gives additional revealing insight to the notion of Western hegemony over the Orient. This part, too contains selected scenes. The conclusion then summarizes the results and provides suggestions for further, related analysis that might be of importance in this context, but that could not be dealt with in the scope of this work.
