Dangerous Sex, Invisible Labor Prabha Kotiswaran 2011-07-25 Popular representations of third-world sex workers as sex slaves and vectors of HIV have spawned abolitionist legal reforms that are harmful and ineffective, and public health initiatives that provide only marginal protection of sex workers' rights. In this book, Prabha Kotiswaran asks how we might understand sex workers' demands that they be treated as workers. She contemplates questions of redistribution through law within the sex industry by examining the political economies and legal ethnographies of two archetypical urban sex markets in India. Kotiswaran conducted in-depth fieldwork among sex workers in Sonagachi, Kolkata's largest red-light area, and Tirupati, a temple town in southern India. Providing new insights into the lives of these women--many of whom are demanding the respect and legal protection that other workers get--Kotiswaran builds a persuasive theoretical case for recognizing these women's sexual labor. Moving beyond standard feminist discourse on prostitution, she draws on a critical genealogy of materialist feminism for its sophisticated vocabulary of female reproductive and sexual labor, and uses a legal realist approach to show why criminalization cannot succeed amid the informal social networks and economic structures of sex markets. Based on this, Kotiswaran assesses the law's redistributive potential by analyzing the possible economic consequences of partial decriminalization, complete decriminalization, and legalization. She concludes with a theory of sex work from a postcolonial materialist feminist perspective.

Sex Work, Health, and Human Rights Shira M. Goldenberg 2021-04-28 This open access book provides a comprehensive overview of the health inequities and human rights issues faced by sex workers globally across diverse contexts, and outlines evidence-based strategies and best practices. Women Working: Prostitution Now Eileen McLeod 2022-08-24 Women who work as prostitutes are struggling against a disadvantaged position in society. The relative poverty in which many women still live in is seen as the cause for prostitution, in that sex is their most saleable commodity and can bring them substantial financial rewards. Originally published in 1982 and drawing on her involvement with PROS (Programme for Reform of the Law on Soliciting), one of the Street Prostitutes' Campaigns in Britain, and on interviews with prostitutes and their clients, the author examines how the financial benefits are offset by the attitudes prostitutes encounter from men. It is shown that while, in some ways, the role of client reflects men's advantageous social position, male clients are often trying to compensate for failure in their marriage, or an inability to conform to the accepted masculine role. What the clients want and the conditions in which prostitutes work are discussed in separate chapters. Meanwhile, the Law, the media and public opinion unite to protect the public face of morality and to condemn prostitutes as a corrupting influence in society. This study concludes by showing how prostitutes' campaigns are struggling with these issues and relates this to the feminist efforts to improve the conditions in which women exist and work.

Leaving Prostitution Sharon S. Engaging Coexistence Breanna Mulhall 2017 For decades, complaints from Vancouver residents and business owners have driven street-based sex workers from the communities in which they work. Legislation has been unsuccessful in eradicating both prostitution and the stigma against sex workers. Solving the problems that arise between sex workers and the community requires a novel approach that focuses on the spatial interplay between these two groups. Architecture is uniquely posed to play a positive role in dissipating the stigma against sex workers and bringing value to communities. The history of Vancouver's sex trade, present realities, rhythms of street-based sex work, and factors that exacerbate stigma shape the current conflict. Politics and laws further influence architecture's role. Subsequently, architecture influences social behavior. This project imagines proactive methods for dissipating stigma and engaging coexistence between sex workers and the Kensington-Cedar Cottage neighbourhood.

Vancouver's Insurance Corporation of British Columbia (ICBC) claim centre on Kingsway, across from where street-based sex workers currently solicit, is the site for the proposed design project. The structure is underused and facilitates vehicular access. With proper design intervention, ICBC has the potential to host a space for sex workers' transactions, and additional public amenities that can contribute to the neighbourhood's vision for revitalization. The beginnings of shared spatial ownership are explored. The present method of segregating sex workers yields only one 'benefit':

society's perceived nuisances are moved out of sight, shifting the burden to another neighbourhood. Integration, albeit more complex, may permit the livelihood of both sex workers, ICBC, and the entire neighbourhood to remain and thrive. Architects have the ability and the responsibility to critically evaluate social conditions. Approaching conflict with a design mindset can allow for the creation of new conditions that can potentially help to engage coexistence.

Short-circuiting Neoliberal Development Megan Stanton 2015 Background: While economic insecurity adversely affects the well-being of sex workers, few studies examine economic interventions in this community. Extant interventions employ microfinance approaches and are limited in scope, scale, and sustainability. Critiques of microfinance initiatives highlight their inability to achieve economic and gender empowerment. Moreover, microfinance interventions among sex workers often fail to address structural causes of economic disempowerment, and do not increase economic agency. This dissertation examines an alternative economic intervention: the Usha Multi-purpose Cooperative Society (Usha), a bank operated by a sex worker's union in Kolkata, India. Examining the organizational structure, culture, and operations of the bank I explore the manner in which Usha addresses the critiques aimed at microfinance initiatives, and the manner in which it cultivates economic and political agency in the sex work community. Methods: Utilizing a mixed-methods case study design, I conducted 80 semi-structured interviews with Usha members (n=60) and staff (n=20), participant observation and document analysis. Additionally, I conducted quantitative analyses of the bank's administrative database (N=14,382). Modified grounded theory and regression models were utilized to analyze the qualitative and quantitative data, respectively. Results: Usha facilitates empowerment through two intersecting operational approaches: its interventions operate at the individual and community levels, while targeting logistical as well as political outcomes. Specifically, Usha offers individual logistical financial support to sex workers through savings and loans programs which reverse predatory practices used by other microfinance initiatives. Community-level logistical financial support is provided by investing in businesses and social programs which benefit the sex worker community. Usha fosters individual sex worker political agency by supporting professional identity, independent decision-making, and sex worker leadership. Community-level political agency is developed by undermining the influence of financially coercive community power-brokers such as madams and pimps, providing labor protections, and facilitating access to civil society institutions. Conclusion: Usha challenges neoliberal approaches that attribute poverty to individual shortcomings, and resists the neocolonial framing of sex workers as victims. These results advance our understanding of how microfinance interventions can support social movements and effect structural change.
