Parental involvement in treatment results in more favorable outcomes with longer treatment gains observed, thus reducing mental health issues. An additional factor in children's mental health is the effect of levels of parental acceptance toward the child. Parental acceptance is a positive outcome that has been observed in previous studies conducted with Child-Parent Relationship Therapy (CPRT). There are many reported barriers to seeking treatment for mental health issues, including time, cost, distance, and access. Online therapies have been found to reduce or eliminate most barriers to treatment, and is a preferred format for certain populations. To date, however, there have been no studies conducted on whether CPRT is effective in increasing levels of parental acceptance in an online format. Eight participants from around the world completed the ten-week CPRT training in an online format. Levels of parental acceptance were measured by the Porter Parental Acceptance Scale (Porter, 1954; PPAS) in self-reported pre- and post-treatment assessments. A perception survey was also conducted to assess participants' perception of the process of an online parent training format, including benefits and challenges. This mixed-methods study found that an online version of CPRT does significantly increase parental acceptance levels. Participants also reported positive perceptions of the online training format. Positive themes reported in the survey responses related to convenience, community, access, and user experience.

Effects on Empathy with a Small Group of Parents of Preadolescent Children who Participated in Child Parent Relationships Therapy Training Andrea Maria Doran 2014 This dual phased, mixed methods designed examined the experiences and the effects of empathy and acceptance on six parents with preadolescent children who participated in Child and Parent Relationship Therapy (CPRT) training. Parents from an experimental and control group participated in a 10-week filial therapy training. The results of the posttest scores of the experimental parent group were compared to the pretest scores of the control group on the Measurement of Empathy in Adult and Child Interactions (MEACI) and the Porter Parental Acceptance Scale (PPAS). Following the training period for both groups parent participants were interviewed regarding their experiences. Parental acceptance of self-direction, involvement and acceptance were shown in the interview responses to be responsible for relationship growth and improved interactions for these parents. Parents were recalled and four out of the original parent participants were interviewed 16 weeks after the completion of their respective training sessions had lapse in order to participate in a closing interview. A narrative inquiry was presented to impart the experiences of these four parents who had participated in filial therapy training with their preadolescent child.
