EXCERPT FROM THE BOOK Try to find out how your child's crush is responding to him. Ask him if his crush talks to him at school.

This will help you gauge the level of intensity and the direction things are headed. If his crush returns his feelings, he may be on the verge of a relationship. While you won't be able to change the eventual outcome of your son's crush, you can guide him as he navigates the unfamiliar waters of romantic feelings. The way you approach the subject will depend on your child's age. For a young child, be positive but truthful when you talk about the crush.

Explain that it's normal to have strong feelings for people when you like their looks and behavior, but make sure your child knows that it's not necessary to act on those feelings. Guide him or her in making appropriate decisions. For instance, if your daughter wants to give a gift to a boy she likes on Valentine's Day, help her

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choose something that won't be overwhelming for either party. If the object of your young child's affection is an adult, don't be overly concerned. According to Dr. Laura Rocker, a pediatric physician, children often experience their first crush on a celebrity or an adult they find attractive.
