Utilization of Sexual Health Services Among Female Sex

Workers Janak Kumar Thapa 2012-06-01 Sexual health services are relatively rare in Nepal. Female sex workers (FSW) do not use health services as often as would be desirable. Study showed that about half percentage of the FSWs utilized the available sexual health services. The knowledge about HIV/AIDS transmission and the knowledge about prevention of HIV/AIDS was significantly associated with utilization of sexual health services among FSWs. Regarding barrier in utilization of sexual health services, about forty percent of the FSWs were not utilizing the available sexual health services. The main reasons for barrier to utilization were due to shyness, fear of diagnosis of HIV/AIDS and inaccessibility along with ignorance about facility and restriction by owner. Of the FSWs whose clients were using condom consistently, about twenty percent did not get condom at the time of need, out of which fifty percent reasoned not getting condom at the time of need due to insufficiency and thirty percent lack of knowledge about the place of availability. The educational status, marital status, drugs use, number of sex partners per month showed significant relationship with the consistent condom use.

Kerrigan 2013 Since the beginning of the epidemic sex workers have experienced a heightened burden of HIV across settings, despite their higher levels of HIV protective behaviors (UNAIDS, 2009). Unfairly, sex workers have often been framed as 'vectors of disease' and 'core transmitters' rather than workers and human beings with rights in terms of HIV prevention and beyond. By gaining a deeper understanding of the epidemiologic and broader policy and social context within which sex work is set one begins to quickly gain a sense of the complex backdrop for increased risk to HIV among sex workers. This backdrop includes the critical role of stigma, discrimination and violence faced by sex workers, as well as, the importance of community empowerment and mobilization among sex workers to address these regressive forces. The eight country case studies work to highlight the experiences of diverse populations of and contexts for sex work across settings. Given the limited epidemiologic and intervention evaluation data available among male and transgender sex workers, however, our collaborative team (Johns Hopkins University, or JHU, World Bank, United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), and Global Network of Sex Work Projects, or NSWP) determined that the systematic review, mathematical modeling and cost-effective analyses would focus on female sex workers. Throughout the process of this analysis as a whole, the participation of sex worker perspectives and sex worker organizations such as NSWP and their regional partners has been critical by providing documents and resources, input and consultation throughout the analytical process.

Use of a dedicated outreach team achieved trusted relationships with sex-workers. Secondary benefits included a 250% increase in women identifying as sex-workers accessing mainstream clinics in Leeds.
