Too Hot to Handle Jonathan Zimmerman 2016-09-13 The first comprehensive history of sex education around the world *Too Hot to Handle* is the first truly international history of sex education. As Jonathan Zimmerman shows, the controversial subject began in the West and spread steadily around the world over the past century. As people crossed borders, however, they joined hands to block sex education from most of their classrooms. In the early 1900s, the United States pioneered sex education to protect citizens from venereal disease. By the early 2000s, nearly every country in the world addressed sex in its official school curriculum. Still, Zimmerman demonstrates that sex education never won a sustained foothold: parents and religious leaders rejected the subject as an intrusion on their authority, while teachers and principals worried that it would undermine their own tenuous powers. Despite the overall liberalization of sexual attitudes, opposition to sex education increased as the century unfolded. Into the present, it remains a subject without a home. *Too Hot to Handle* presents the stormy development and dilemmas of school-based sex education in the modern world.

Not a Choice, Not a Job JANICE G. RAYMOND 2013-07-15 A generation ago, most people did not know how ubiquitous and grave human trafficking was. Now many people agree that the \$35.7 billion business is an appalling violation of human rights. But when confronted with prostitution, many people experience an odd disconnect because prostitution is shrouded in myths, among them the claims that "prostitution is inevitable," and "prostitution is a job or service like any other." In *Not a Choice, Not a Job*, Janice Raymond challenges both the myths and their perpetrators.
