He exposes the reliance of much Church and theological teaching about sex and gender either on biblical proof texts or upon the language and

nomenclature of late modernity, rather than upon considerations of Theology and Christology. Thatcher also indicates how Theology and Christology, in the area of gender, envisions the redemption of human relationships.
