Setting aside the moral debates and psychological assessments surrounding abstinence, Jamie L. Studies in the United States in the 1970s revealed "a gradual decrease over time in the percentage of respondents who said that premarital sex is always wrong". Another important change which derived from the liberation movement was the new female sexuality, especially concerning the sexual fulfilment of women before and during marriage. This is also proved by a decreasing support of the 'double standard', where men are more or less allowed to be sexual active, including premarital and even extramarital sex, but women are not. You also have to consider the women's movement, when thinking about female sexual liberation. Both, sexual liberation and feminism, somehow worked
