This touching memoir also explores the painful break-up just six months later in Rome. Tabachnick delves into the vivid kaleidoscope of Jewish beliefs and identities, ranging from Orthodox belief to complete atheism, and a spectrum of feelings about identification with other Jews. He explores graphic novels at the highest echelon of the genre by more than thirty artists and writers, among them Harvey Pekar (*American Splendor*), Will Eisner (*A Contract with God*), Joann Sfar (*The Rabbi's Cat*), Miriam Katin (*We Are On Our Own*), Art Spiegelman (*Maus*), J. T.
